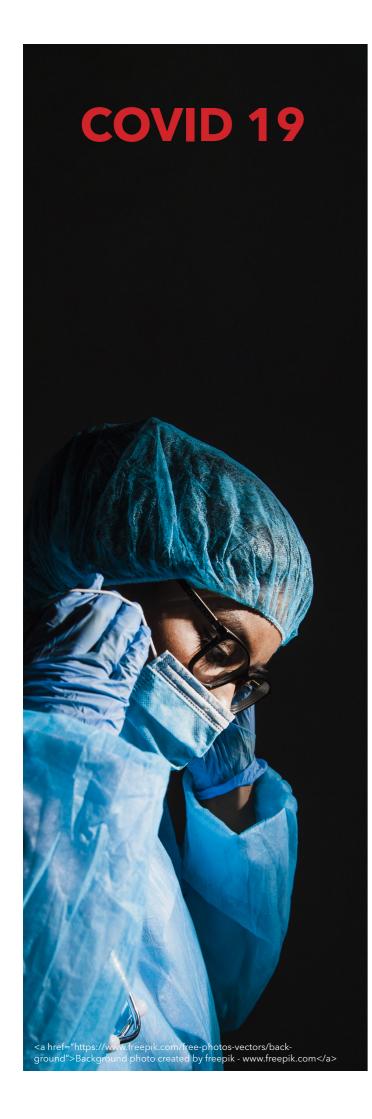

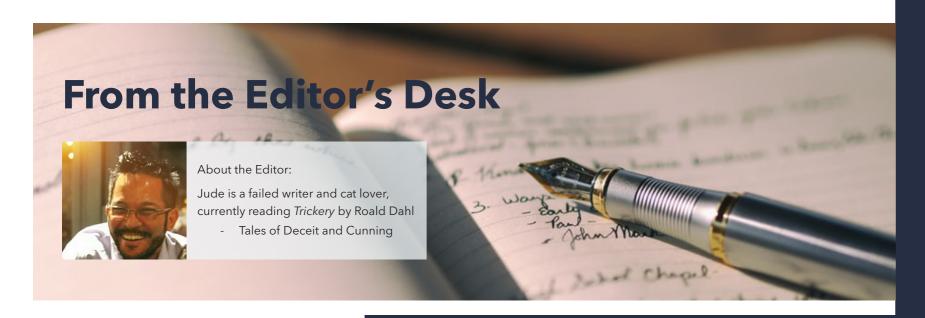












### Saving Sanity in the Time of Corona

When I was reminded to write this editorial piece, which is kind of overdue, the first thing that came to mind was that I needed a cigarette. After what it seems like a million years of drafting, copyediting and soliloquising the corporate section of our 2019 Annual Report and Sustainability Report, naturally, I've had it about enough with my relationship with letters. So, you'd understand that when asked to rekindle that relationship with this bulletin, I didn't feel at all that spritely.

It is a dreadful buzz, to be honest, writing this piece. On one hand, I have this hopeless proclivity toward the dramatic, so I worry that in my enervated, deathby-letters state, any words I could string together and pen on this page would be pessimistically trite. On the other, what's there to write about in this sanity-eroding and carb-loading house arrest?

I guess, there is one.

Everything takes on a new meaning when the rug is pulled out from under you. The sinister rug that is COVID-19. So, it feels not only appropriate but also necessary, to lament the transient end of the pre-COVID-19 era in KPS. It feels appropriate even to romanticise it a little - not because the Company's affairs of yesterday were a walk in the park, but because its situation of today and the impact the pandemic has on KPS' business, are, for lack of better words, a royal suck.

This very bad black swan has reared so many things, some predictable, others sudden; some pretty, others quite ugly. In the process, it has caused so many of us to gain weight due to the MCO. It has also made us reach out for the scissors to put some order to our hair, but of course for many, with mixed results.

As a business entity responding to the pandemic, KPS is sailing uncharted - and just maybe, murky - waters. The global supply chain has never been yanked so badly and unexpectedly that it disrupts the economic equilibrium around the world. Our manufacturing subsidiaries have never had to curtail production and worry if the anticipated global demand shock would stifle orders by the end customers. And for most of us, we have never been forced to work from the comfort of our homes yet tested of our efficacy in juggling the office tasks and domestic chores all at once, some with toddlers - and in my case, feline creatures - clinging around us.

Scrolling through the history of KPS since its incorporation in 1975, one will find no parallels in what the Group is now facing - nothing to draw on, nothing to consult. But the good thing is, we have the governance system to lead us through this crisis: the CMT-BCP.

Alhamdulillah, we were quick to steady the ground, leading KPS to a new way of working in response to the MCO. We had set clear expectations on work priorities and responsibilities: for the immediate term, with regards to the safety of our people and the day-to-day business; for the medium-term, our finances such as cash conservation and steady balance sheet; and for the long-term, the possibility of a major economic impact on the Group and our adjusting to the new normal, whenever, this new normal might manifest itself.

As early as January, we have started working to ensure the business continuity not only at the HQ but also and more importantly, at our subsidiary companies; especially at our manufacturing subsidiaries - Toyoplas, CPI, CBB and KKMW. In stabilising the business, we have had active communication with our customers to better understand their requirements under the current condition as well as with the existing and new suppliers to ensure a sustainable supply of raw materials. This was followed by practical coordination with the customers and the respective contract manufacturers for optimum production planning based on limited production capacity and demand.

On the assumption that COVID-19 will disproportionately impact highly geared businesses and those with relatively low cash buffers, our next action was ensuring adequate liquidity to support the Group's operations. We have run a few scenarios on stress testing on our financials, knowing very well that this pandemic will result in liquidity tightening for everyone. Our goal now is to optimise cashflows, manage costs and preserve liquidity. Tweaking the way we spend will definitely be on the cards.

Possibly, one of the instances of tweaking our spending is that at least for this year, we may not carry out as many CSR initiatives as we did. We can start capping our CSR commitment in line with the profitability of the Company, pivoting it to not more than 2% of PBT, like the rest of corporations around the world is practising. Perhaps.

In mapping the impact of COVID-19 on the Group's business, we have analysed our business sensitivity to a few probable scenarios based on when the pandemic is expected to peak and normalise. There is the best case, which at this point I think very unlikely for it happening; the base case; and the worst case, which the Group is currently leaning towards given our prudence and conservative strategic stance. As to how much it will impact the Group profitability this year, we should attain better clarity into the second quarter, given the fluidity of the pandemic still as we speak.

As we hunker down in our new-found way of life, spooked by the worst health crisis ever known to humanity in the last 100 years, we owe it to the future to respond today in some tangible manner, to document in the coming days and months, as to how we strategise, organise and protect the Group's business. So that in the coming years, when our stakeholders look back to understand how we coped, they will see nothing but steadfastness, agility and determination in our part to carry on and return the Group to the position of strength.

I am talking funny and earnest, confident and scared, all at the same time. But one thing for sure, I just want to win back the two things I have lost to coronavirus: control and mobility.

Before I leave you to your own devices, please allow me to wish those who are of Muslim faith, have a blessed Ramadhan. And to others, please keep your distance, stay safe and till we meet again.

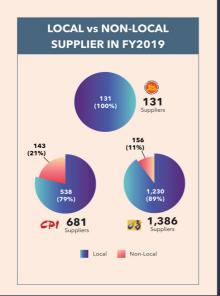

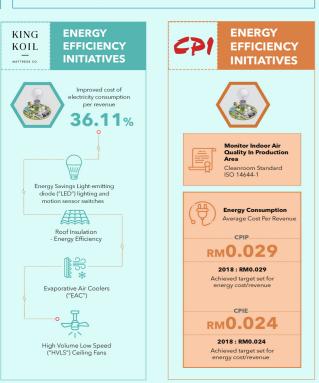

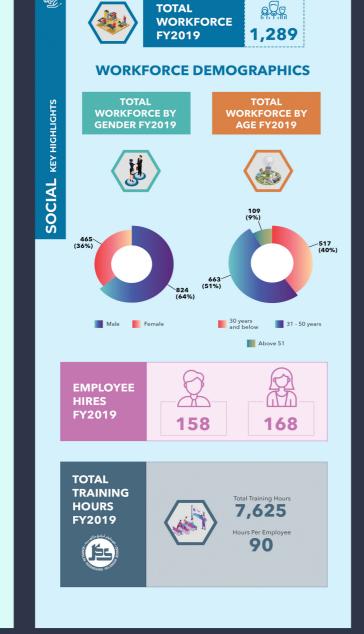

# 4Q2019 Results Briefing







**27** February 2020: We organised 4Q2019 Results Briefing at Element Hotel, Level 40, Ilham Tower. It featured KPS' Senior Management team and attended by 20 fund managers and analysts from various Financial Institutions.

The purpose of this briefing was to give an overview of KPS overall business for 2019, key challenges and practical solutions in our business journey.

Our MD/GCEO explained that for the quarter ended 31 December 2019, KPS posted a revenue of RM297.9million, 73.7% jump from RM171.5million it recorded in the corresponding quarter last year.

Meanwhile, he added that for the financial year 2019, the Group posted a revenue of RM866.8million, an increase by 48.9%, as compared to RM582.3million it recorded in the corresponding period in 2018. Manufacturing businesses grew by 82.1%, contributing RM650.9million, or 75.1%. The trading, licensing and infrastructure businesses remained significant, contributing RM117.4million or 13.5%, RM36.3million or 4.2% and RM51.4million or 5.9% to the Group's revenue, respectively. Property investments contributed the remaining RM10.8million or 1.2%

The event ended with questions and answers session.

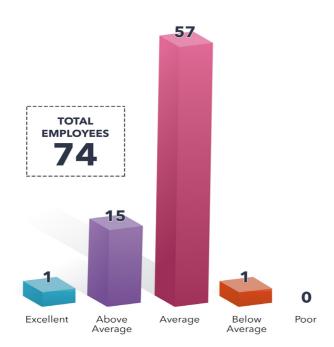
M D/GCEO, En Ahmad Fariz Hassan, presented the approved 2019 Performance Bonus & 2020 Performance Increment to all staff.

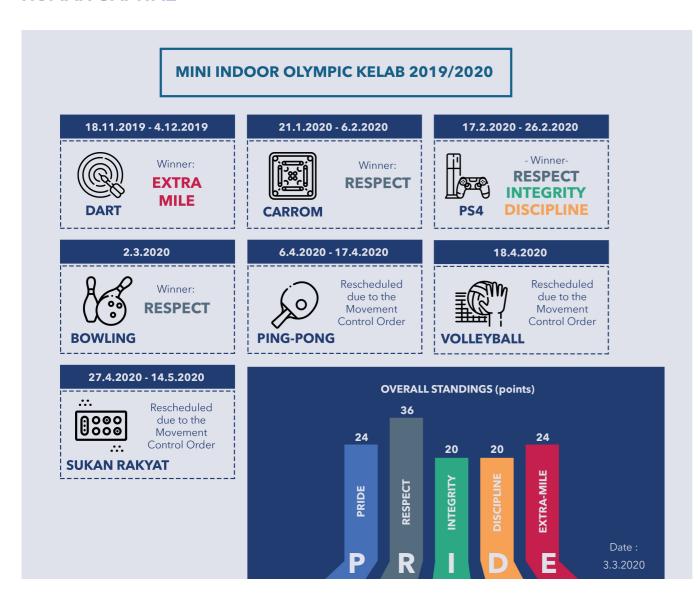

# **KPS CerDik Programme**

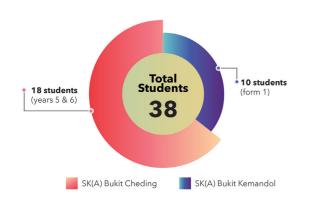
A Collaboration between Kumpulan Perangsang Selangor Berhad & InspiraComm

KPS CerDik's threemonth programme was conducted to provide learning opportunities through experiential learning at the same time complementing the school education system and supporting the school community.

We are inspired to continue our support in the educational development for Orang Asal community, focussing on providing quality education to the Orang Asal children in a way that will help them advance their skills and knowledge through a process of interactive learning, debate, action and study tour.

This was not a typical community engagement programme as it was a programme to create self-awareness in which the modules were developed following consultation with the stakeholders. It involved the establishment of objectives whereby impacts were measured and documented systematically. For the first quarter this year, the attendance rate was 100% surpassing the 2019 results of 90%.

KPS looks forward to continuing coaching these students especially on how to be more organised in their preparation to sit for the exams.

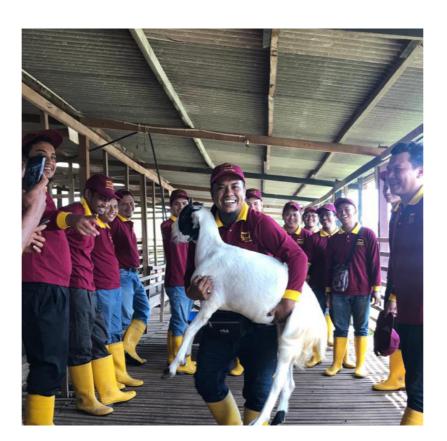

# Interview with the Managing Director/ Group CEO

Engagement with the media fraternity is crucial for improving awareness on KPS' business profiling, direction and potentials as well as conveying the right messages to the shareholders and other stakeholders.

Some of the questions raised during the interview are as below:

It looks like KPS have been acquiring at quite a fast pace. Are you expanding too fast? In terms of managing the new companies as well as the gearing point of view.

Not too fast. In fact, just as planned. Our balance sheet and cashflow supported our acquisitions that we have made in 2019 and previously. To ensure control, KPS has EXCO members that monitors the subsidiaries on a day-to-day basis. Gearing currently at the region of 0.7x. Planning to reduce to 0.2x in 5-year time.

The manufacturing business is doing well while other segments are quite small in terms of earnings, is this how KPS will be known going forward - as an investment holding for manufacturing business?

Although currently we have focus in manufacturing industry, KPS is an investment holding company that invests in industries where the investments are long term as our intention is to work with management to build these companies organically or through horizontal integration ultimately making our investments regional champions.

This year, we started off on a shaky note. Global growth slowdown, Covid-19 becoming pandemic, political uncertainty, etc. What is KPS' focus this year in light of all that is happening?

With all that is happening, it gives more reasons for us to continuously grow our businesses. Looking ahead, we expect to improve the Group's profitability further by focusing on an improvement in operational efficiency, penetration of new market segments and on expansion of product mix and services across the subsidiaries. This will also be supported by a strategic repositioning of the Group which will see KPS redefine and strengthen its brand in the marketplace.

With respect to COVID19, KPS are carefully monitoring the situation to assess how it would affect the business.

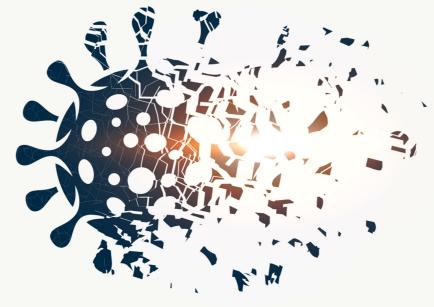

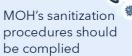

#### 1. Closure of Premises from 18 to 31 March 2020



Pursuant to the issuance of the Movement Control Order ("MCO") by the Government of Malaysia under the Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases Act 1988 and Police Act 1967, all government and private entities would be closed except those providing essential services. In line with the MCO, CMT now officially declares \*"CODE RED" for all its business operations in Malaysia.







Of KPS' subsidiary operations in Malaysia, the manufacturing activities that involve the manufacturing of goods that are part of the supply chain of essential goods, such as that of Toyoplas Manufacturing (Malaysia) Sdn Bhd, CPI (Penang) Sdn Bhd, Century Bond Bhd and Aqua-Flo Sdn Bhd, are EXEMPT from the restriction prescribed in the MCO, subject to the conditions set forth by the National Security Council which the subsidiary companies will strictly adhere to, and to other approvals from relevant authorities. However, the operations of KPS' other subsidiary companies, such as that of Smartpipe Technology Sdn Bhd and KPS-HCM Sdn

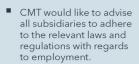

All communication with regards to WFH should be communicated via company's email, whatsapp, webex (by cisco), Microsoft Team and all other means of communication. All meetings will be conducted via video conferencing using Webex application.



#### 4. Communication with Suppliers and Customers

Heads of Subsidiaries and Senior Management Team need to communicate to relevant parties which include suppliers, customers, financial institutions and transportation companies on potential delays resulted from this MCO.

### 5. Implication on reporting and other deadlines











 All contractual terms in manufacturing and supply agreements need to be carefully reviewed to avoid any potential litigations and disputes.



 We should minimize further losses that could derived from this MCO



#### 7. Travelling & Self-Quarantine



The MCO makes specific mention on the overall restriction of movement and gatherings throughout the country. All overseas travels are prohibited. Returning employees after the MCO takes effect must be under self-quarantine for 14 days and undergo medical screening.

 All subsidiaries should not accept any visitors from outside Malaysia duringthis period.

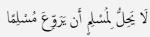
